

**CITY OF TEMPLE CITY**  
**CITY COUNCIL MEETING ACTIONS**

These are some of the City Council actions from their meeting of July 20, 2010. This is an unofficial record of the City Council meeting. The Minutes, once approved by the City Council, become the official record of the Meeting.

At the meeting of July 20, 2010, the City Council:

- Presented a proclamation to Matthew Wong, founder, and staff of the *Temple City Voice* in recognition of the newsletter's fourth anniversary of providing newsworthy articles and raising awareness of issues surrounding Temple City;
- Awarded a Contract for the Live Oak Park Playground Equipment Replacement Project;
- Authorized the City Manager to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Volunteer Center of San Gabriel Valley for use of Court Referred Community Service Program volunteers;
- Accepted the New Traffic Signals on Temple City Boulevard and Ellis Lane Project as complete;
- Awarded a Construction Contract for the Traffic Signal Upgrades on Temple City Boulevard at Las Tunas Drive and Baldwin Avenue at Olive Street Project;
- Accepted the Freer Street Asphalt Overlay Project as complete;
- Approved Administrative Policy No. 3.02 – Reimbursement of Travel and Expenses for Elected and Appointed Officials;
- Adopted a Resolution approving classifications and salary ranges for the Community Development Director, Economic Development Manager/Assistant to the City Manager, and Code Enforcement Supervisor positions;
- Determined the location for permanent placement of the bust of Walter P. Temple to be incorporated into the new monument sign at the southeast corner of Temple City Park, selected one of the architect's design options and directed staff to return with additional design detail alternatives based on the City Council's collective input;
- Introduced an Ordinance amending the Zoning Code to define "hedges" and eliminate the hedge height requirement in the rear yard area of residential properties;
- Received Council Reports on recent meetings of the Retail Pursuit Ad Hoc Committee, Youth Committee Liaison interviews and the City Protocol Ad Hoc Committee; and
- Requested the Parks and Recreation Commission and/or staff to pursue possible park funding through the Eaton Wash Corridor Planning process.
