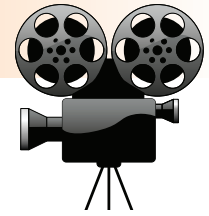

## Temple City Practices the Three "Rs"

**Reduce** your impact by incorporating these simple steps into your daily routine. Turn off lights and appliances when not in use. Use fewer disposable household items such as paper plates and plastic utensils. Buy in bulk when possible. Make sure your dishwasher and washing machine are full prior to use. Use cold water when washing your clothes to save energy. Hang your clothes up to dry more often. Use water wisely! Go to [www.bewaterwise.com](http://www.bewaterwise.com) for more information on water saving tips.

**Reuse** to conserve natural resources! Plastic grocery bags rank as one of the top items of debris found in coastal cleanups. Most plastic bags are not biodegradable rather they photodegrade - meaning they break down into smaller toxic bits contaminating soil and waterways entering the food web when animals accidentally ingest. If you receive plastic bags try to reuse or recycle them. However, the best solution is to buy reusable grocery bags.

**Recycle** your motor oil, filters, newspapers, beverage containers, plastic bags, clothes and yard waste. Visit [www.earth911.com](http://www.earth911.com) for information on what, where and how to recycle! Recycle used oil and filters! Motor oil doesn't wear out, it just gets dirty! Your used oil should be recycled and never thrown in the trash or down the gutter. Be sure to drain the filters over night and properly dispose of at a recycling center: AutoZone #5463 (6300 Rosemead Blvd., 287-7345), EZ Lube #26 (5658 Rosemead Blvd., 619-1546), Pep Boy #836 (5439 Rosemead Blvd., 285-2325). Call these centers for hours and quantities of oil accepted. Remember it is illegal to leave your oil unattended at any recycling center after hours.

## Prevent Stormwater Pollution!

Simple changes in your everyday routine can impact the reduction of stormwater pollution. Here are some things you can do: keep lids on your trash cans, do regular vehicle maintenance and fix leaks, put cigarette butts in an ash tray and not on the ground, pick up after your pets at home and on walks and use chemicals and pesticides sparingly and never prior to a rain event.

Reduce stormwater pollution while saving water by: sweeping up instead of hosing down and do not overwater your lawn! The extra water runs down the gutter creating stormwater pollution and wastes water.

Keeping the environment clean is everyone's responsibility. A little change in conducting everyday activities can mean a big change to the environment. If you see any illegal dumping or discharging activity, you are asked to report the incident to the City's Public Services Department at (626) 285-2171, or the Sheriff's Station at (626) 285-7171 immediately.

# Keeping You Informed

## Handyworker Grant Program

The Handyworker Grant Program continues to help low and moderate-income Temple City homeowners improve and beautify their properties. Improvements covered by the program include roofing, plumbing, pest extermination, structural repairs, window replacement, painting work, and general home maintenance.

To qualify for the Handyworker Grant Program, the home must be owner occupied, and the household income must be within a certain range of the County median income. The maximum grant amount for the Handyworker Grant Program is \$10,000, and the grant is not repaid to the City. There are no age restrictions to participate in this program, property owners qualify based on income guidelines.

## Home Improvement Deferred Loan Program

This program provides loans to low and moderate-income homeowners. The maximum loan amount is \$25,000 with a simple interest rate of three percent. Payment is deferred until sale of property or change in title. As is the case with the Handyworker Grant Program, there are no age restrictions to participate in this program, property owners qualify based on income guidelines.

Both housing programs are offered year-round and there is no deadline to apply for either program. It should be noted that it is possible to participate in both programs. ## City Hires Economic Development Consultant

The City Council recently hired Avant Garde, a private consultant, to provide redevelopment and economic development services. For several years, the City has been interested in improving our commercial districts, mainly the Las Tunas Drive corridor, as this is our downtown core. Although we do have a Downtown Specific Plan in place to guide future development on Las Tunas, private development must occur to fully realize the goals of the Specific Plan. Therefore, the City Council selected Avant Garde among three firms to help stimulate economic growth along Las Tunas.

Avant Garde will evaluate the feasibility of creating a redevelopment area along Las Tunas, which would provide additional tools for future development. Also, Avant Garde will explore other types of economic development measures to stimulate business growth and hopefully building activity on Las Tunas.

The City Council will be discussing these issues at future meetings, and they may create a subcommittee to oversee the process. So, keep your eyes open for redevelopment and economic development discussions at future meetings. Public input will be imperative to this process, and your opinion counts!

## A Fond Farewell

For over 30 years, Chuck Erickson would get up at the crack of dawn, put on his uniform, and make his way to work. For most of that time (almost 20 years), the uniform was bright orange. Chuck would start his day at 6 a.m., reporting to the City's maintenance yard for his assignment which usually entailed keeping the parks in tip-top shape. Later in his career, the uniform changed to a more subdued black and white, and his job duties changed from field work to supervising and coordinating other staff. This spring, after 33 years of employment with the City of Temple City, Chuck announced his retirement.

Chuck Erickson started his career with the City of Temple City in 1975 as a maintenance man through the CETA program. The CETA program provided full time jobs, to qualified individuals, for a period of 12 to 24 months in public agencies. The intent was to teach a marketable skill that would allow participants to move to an unsubsidized job. The program worked as it was intended, because in 1976, Chuck was appointed to a permanent position with the City of Temple City. Through hard work and dedication, Chuck worked his way up from Maintenance Man to Park Maintenance Lead Worker,

Maintenance Supervisor, Maintenance Superintendent, and eventually Public Services

Manager, the position he has held for the last four years. Whether Chuck was mowing the fields at the park, making electrical repairs, managing sewer reconstruction projects, or coordinating code enforcement efforts, he did it with enthusiasm and pride.

Throughout his time in Temple City, Chuck has been involved in many community events and has assisted countless residents with their calls for service. He has worked with five City Managers, dozens of Council members, and hundreds of City employees. His cheerful smile and friendly greetings will be missed.

Chuck plans to spend much of his free time pursuing his other loves, fishing and racing. He looks forward to having more time to race his dragster. We wouldn't be surprised to see Chuck in the winner's circle one day soon!

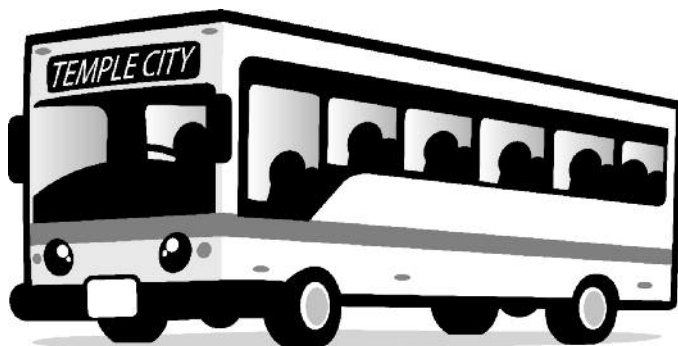
