The City of Temple City is pleased to provide you with the Summer 2006 City Newsletter and Community Service Guide.

Summer is a perfect time to try something new. There are many recreation classes available to help you learn or develop a skill to better enjoy your leisure hours. Whether it's dance, fitness, art, computers, or music, we have it for you. You can easily register for classes on-line through RecConnect or in person at the Live Oak Park Community Center.

The City's very popular summer concert series kicks off in mid-June with perennial favorite "Ronny and the Classics". Every Wednesday, Temple City Park will be host to hundreds of music lovers singing and dancing to the oldies, classic rock, and country music. While they may not be the "real thing", Elvis, Tom Jones and the Beatles will be thrilling the crowds with their all time favorites. A complete line-up of the summer concert series is included in this newsletter.

Since 1998, the community has gathered at Temple City Park the first weekend in July to celebrate Independence Day with a patriotic concert and community barbeque. This year, we are honored to host the United States Air Force Band of the Golden West. The Concert Band, comprised of 45 musicians, has performed for thousands of listeners touring the western states. We hope you will join us in welcoming the United States Air Force Band of the Golden West to Temple City.

During those hot summer afternoons, the pool at Temple City High School will be open for recreational swimming and swim lessons. We are grateful to the Temple City Unified School District for opening their pool during the summer months to the community and to the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation for providing the lifeguards and staff necessary to operate the swim program.

And finally, a gentle reminder that summer is also the time to renew your dog's license. All licenses expire on June 30th and must be renewed prior to August 1st to avoid a late fee. A rabies clinic will be held at Temple City Park on July 7th offering low cost rabies vaccines. A variety of pet vendors will be on hand to provide free samples and information on their products.

We hope you will spend some time at one of our beautiful parks this summer, just relaxing or participating in one of the many activities that are offered. The City Council and City staff offers you our best wishes for a very enjoyable summer.

Wading Pool Opens

The wading pool at Live Oak Park will open beginning Memorial Day weekend. Children under 5 years of age can enjoy the wading pool seven days a week from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. The wading pool is cleaned and inspected daily, but no lifeguards will be on duty. Parents/guardians are required to sit inside the gates and supervise their children. Please remember that no jumping, diving, running or rough horseplay is allowed in the wading pool, as it is only 1½ feet deep in the middle.

Here are just a few tips to make your visit to the Live Oak Park wading pool a pleasant one! First, and most importantly, be sure to keep a close eye on your little one while they are in or near the water. Second, remember your sunscreen, towels and swimsuits (only swimsuits or swim diapers are allowed, no diapers). Don't forget sandals or water socks. Young tender feet may crack or even bleed after an extended time in the pool; also summer sidewalks can be very hot!

SAFE AND SANE FIREWORKS

A few reminders as the fireworks season is almost here . . . the City of Temple City allows the sale of only "safe and sane" fireworks. Fireworks may be sold and discharged from 12 noon on June 30th until 12 noon on July 5th. Fireworks must be discharged so as not to be hazardous to any property or endanger any person.

New Picnic Shelter Reservation Policy

Picnics, family gatherings and birthday parties are all part of enjoying a relaxing afternoon at a park. Live Oak Park welcomes thousands of visitors each summer and is a great place to spend a lazy summer afternoon.

Live Oak Park amenities include two picnic shelters, a large playground area, barbecues, wading pool and basketball courts. Effective July 1, 2006 both picnic shelters will be available as reserved shelters, free of charge. Each shelter will be available daily from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. including holidays. A security deposit is required for all reservations.

A completed application and security deposit must be received to confirm a reservation. The Picnic Shelter Reservation Policies and Procedures and Application are available at the Live Oak Park Community Center or at www.templecity.us.

Handyworker Program Offers Assistance to Homeowner

As many readers know, the Community Development Department is the place to obtain building permits, planning and zoning information, and business licenses. But did you know that we also provide two different housing improvement assistance programs? The Home Improvement Deferred Loan Program has been available to income-qualified Temple City homeowners for several years and offers assistance in the form of a low-interest loan up to \$25,000. The funds are intended to repair or replace heating, plumbing, electrical, or structural items in the home.

Last year, the City Council adopted the Handyworker Assistance Program, available as a one-time grant, up to \$5,000. Improvements covered by the Program include essential repairs such as roofing, plumbing, pest extermination, and necessary structural repairs as well as window replacement, painting work, and general home repair. The major goals of the program are to augment the City's efforts to improve housing and property conditions and to ensure that all Temple City residents live in a safe and functional home.

To qualify for the Handyworker Assistance Program, the home must be owner occupied, and the household income must be within a certain range of the area medium income. The City utilizes either CDBG (Community Development

Block Grant) or CRA (Community Redevelopment Agency) funds for the Handyworker Program. Depending on the funds available, qualifying income limits may vary. In general, the total household income cannot exceed 80% of the Los Angeles County median household income.

To initiate the process, a Handyworker Assistance Grant Program application must be completed and returned to the Community Development Department. The City also requires that qualified applicants submit a copy of a Grant Deed and a copy of the last two tax returns for ownership and income verification purposes. Once the application is approved, the City enters into an agreement with the homeowner and the contractor to complete the work. When the project is completed to the satisfaction of the homeowner, the contractor is paid directly by the City.

The Handyworker Assistance Program is easy to apply for and is intended to be quick and easy to participate in. Qualified homeowners can use the program to quickly improve their properties, and help keep Temple City beautiful!

Take Care While Walking Fido

With the evenings warming up, more people will be outdoors walking their dogs. The City of Temple City Animal Control Department would like to pass on a few reminders that should be followed for the health and safety of all.

When you are walking your dog, make sure your dog is on a leash. It is important that whoever is holding the leash, has proper control of the dog. Even the most well trained dog could become excited in an unfamiliar situation. A pooper-scooper or a plastic bag should always be part of your gear when walking your pet. Be sure to pick up your dogs droppings and dispose of properly.

The Temple City Municipal Code requires that you place the license tag on your dog's collar. This lets people know that your dog has received its rabies vaccination and also assists the Animal Control Department in locating the owner of a lost dog. Please keep these rules in mind as you and your pet venture out into the neighborhood.



Rabies Clinic and Dog License Renewals

The City of Temple City will again sponsor a public rabies clinic on Friday, July 7th from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., at Temple City Park, 9701 Las Tunas Drive, Temple City. The cost of the rabies vaccination is \$5 per dog. Dr. Stephen Rohan from Companion Animal Hospital will be on hand to give the rabies vaccinations and to answer any questions you might have.

Resident dog owners may also purchase their license at the clinic. The license fee for a male or female dog is \$30 and \$15 for altered animals with proof of sterility. Senior citizens (65 years or older) may license one altered dog per household, free of charge. All Temple City dog licenses expire on June 30 and *must* be renewed prior to August 1, 2006 to avoid a late fee.

Senior Activities

Homeowner and Renter Assistance Program

With the cost of housing so high, the California Homeowner and Renter Assistance (HRA) Program comes as a relief for many. The program is designed to help seniors and disabled people with a financial break.

The homeowner portion of the program ensures that seniors who have low-to-moderate fixed incomes will not be forced out of their homes because of property taxes. The Homeowners' Assistance Program gives a once-a-year payment from the state to qualified recipients based on property taxes paid by homeowners and indirectly paid by renters.

To be eligible for homeowners' assistance, claimants must be at least 62 years old, blind or disabled, and have a household income of \$38,505 or less as of December 31, 2005. The program also requires that claimants must have lived in the home they own as of December 31, 2005, and be a U.S. citizen, designated alien or qualified alien when the claim is filed.

The program also offers assistance to tenants. Renters must meet the same eligibility requirements as those applying for the homeowners program. Applicants in this category must pay at least \$50 a month for rent. In both the homeowner and renter program, those who have the highest income will receive the lowest amount of assistance. Call (626) 579-0461 after June 5 to schedule an appointment. Appointments will be available beginning Wednesday, July 5 for assistance with the required paperwork.

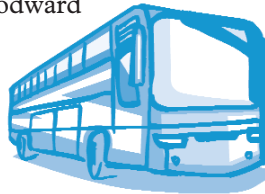
