

**CITY OF TEMPLE CITY  
CITY COUNCIL MEETING ACTIONS**

These are some of the City Council actions from their meeting of April 4, 2023. This is an unofficial record of the City Council meeting. The Minutes, once approved by the City Council at a subsequent meeting, become the official record of the meeting.

At the Special meeting of April 4, 2023, the City Council:

- Met in Closed Session regarding “Potential Litigation”. There is no reportable action; and
- Met in Closed Session regarding “Significant Exposure to Litigation, Facts Unknown to the Plaintiff”. There is no reportable action.

At the Regular meeting of April 4, 2023, the City Council:

- Received an update from South Coast Air Quality Management District regarding air quality;
- Approved the City Council Special and Regular Meeting Minutes of March 21, 2023 and found that the City Council Minutes is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guideline 15061(b)(3);
- Received and filed the Planning Commission Actions and found that the commission actions is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guideline 15061(b)(3);
- Reviewed and approved the final subdivision map for Parcel Map No. 83179, authorized the City Clerk to certify Parcel Map No. 83179, and found the project exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15303 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures) and Section 15332 (In-fill Development Projects) of the California CEQA Guidelines;
- Received and filed the Visa Card Report and found that the report is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Section 15061(b)(3);
- Adopted Resolution No. 23-5662 approving payment of bills for Fiscal Year 2022-23 and found that the payment of bills is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guideline 15061(b)(3);
- Reviewed and approved the Second Amendment to the Service Agreement (Attachment “A”) with Gretchen Sterling to operate and manage the Temple City Certified Farmers Market, authorized the City Manager to sign and execute the Service Agreement, and found that approval of the Service Agreement is not a “Project” as defined under Section 15378 of the California Environmental Quality Act State Guidelines; therefore, pursuant to State Guidelines Section 15060(c)(3) no environmental review is required;
- Continued the public hearing for introduction and first reading of Ordinance No. 23-1072 to amend City’s Municipal Code to comply with the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Permit;
- Introduced Ordinance No. 23-1070 for first reading by title only, amending Title 9, Chapter 1 of the Municipal Code related to artificial turf, landscaping and hardscape, waived further reading of Ordinance No. 23-1070, scheduled the second reading of the ordinance for April 18, 2023, and found that this Ordinance is not subject to environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Sections 15061(b)(3) because it can be seen with certainty that the Ordinance has no possibility of a significant effect on the environment. Further, any project reviewed under this ordinance would be a class 1, 3, 4, or 5 categorical exemption;
- Received updates from the City Attorney and City Manager;
- Received Councilmember reports on items separate from the meeting agenda.
