9. NEW BUSINESS

A. TEMPLE CITY BOULEVEARD AND LEMON AVENUE TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY PRESENTATION (NO ATTACHMENT)

Youth Committee members petitioned the Transportation and Public Safety Commission to implement pedestrian and traffic safety measures around Temple City High School to address concerns collected from a community survey. The Transportation and Public Safety Commission proposed that the Youth Committee work with Transtech to determine which pedestrian and traffic safety measures are feasible.

Chairman Blatt opened public comments.

Brian Lewin - Rosemead Resident Mr. Lewin recommended installing bulb outs at the intersections of Trelawney Avenue and Lemon Avenue and Temple City Boulevard and Lemon Avenue. He explained that bulb outs have the effect of narrowing down an intersection which will in turn produce a traffic calming effect. However, this measure will only be effective if pedestrians utilize it.

The Transportation and Public Safety Commission agreed to discuss the findings that result from the collaborate efforts of the Youth Committee and Transtech Engineers at a future meeting.
